Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity the participant will be able to:

- Describe the SBIRT system (Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment), an evidence-based intervention for patients with low, medium or severe alcohol or drug use;
- Integrate the use of motivational techniques to influence patients to reduce unhealthy behaviors;
- Formulate a framework for providing SBIRT services in office-based settings including the use of electronic health records, billing codes, etc.;
- Apply effective substance use screening and intervention within a busy primary care or specialty care practice; and
- Relate the rationale for, the use of and how to register for the PDMP in the context of prescribing controlled medications and screening for substance use, misuse and addiction.
